A Sainte-Marthe-sur-le-Lac student wins 5 000\$ in a National writing contest on "The Meaning of Home"

Deux-Montagnes, April 3rd 2012 - Jacob Frigault, a Sainte-Marthe-sur-le-Lac fifth grade student was chosen as a runner-up for his entry in the National writing contest sponsored by Genworth Canada, one of Habitat for Humanity Canada's main partners. His essay won him an iPod, a pizza party for his whole class at school and a 5 000\$ check to be given to the Habitat for Humanity affiliate of his choice. Jacob chose to donate the money to Habitat pour l'humanité région des Deux-Montagnes.

"We are very happy that Jacob has chosen our affiliate as a recipient of the 5 000\$ check that he won thanks to his touching essay on The Meaning of Home. Not only will this check help us build our second Habitat home but this contest helps provide a positive experience ultimately creating a generation of more engaged and compassionate citizens" confided Mr. Denis Pilon, Président of Habitat pour l'humanité région des Deux-Montagnes.

Genworth Canada sponsored the Meaning of Home writing contest in 2007 to sensitize young Canadians to the importance of having a safe and secure home and to encourage them to give back to the community by putting pencil to paper. Since then, Genworth Canada has donated more than 450 000\$ to more than 30 Habitat for Humanity affiliates across Canada.

The winning essay and those of the runner-ups were selected from amongst 24 semi-finalists. To celebrate the fifth anniversary of The Meaning of Home contest, Genworth Canada and Habitat for Humanity will publish a commemorative book with the finalist essays from the past five years. All proceeds from the book sales will be donated to Habitat for Humanity Canada affiliates.
